

## A Future of Expulsions

Today's socioeconomic and environmental dislocations cannot be fully understood in the usual terms of poverty and injustice, but more accurately in terms of expulsion—from professional livelihood, from living space, even from the very biosphere that makes life possible. At this seminar, Saskia Sassen will draw from her most previous book *Expulsions. Brutality and Complexity in the Global Economy* where she examines the shrinking global economies, the new global market for land, the triumph of finance capital, and the dying environment.
